



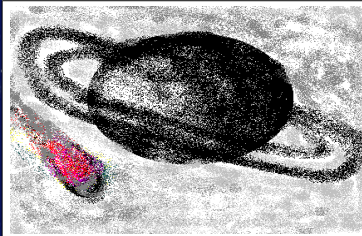
Using there, their and they're

There - This word is an adverb. It is used to indicate a place, such as in: "Put it down over there please," she said. It also can be used to introduce a sentence where the verb comes before its subject such as in: There was a crowd at the concert.

Their - This word is an adjective. It means 'belonging to them' such as in : *The children picked up their bags as it was time to go home.*

They're - This is a contraction of the words **they** and **are**. Such as in: *They're watching the football match.*
